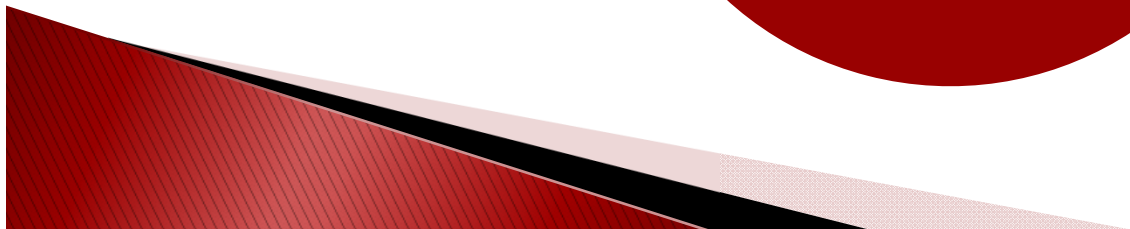
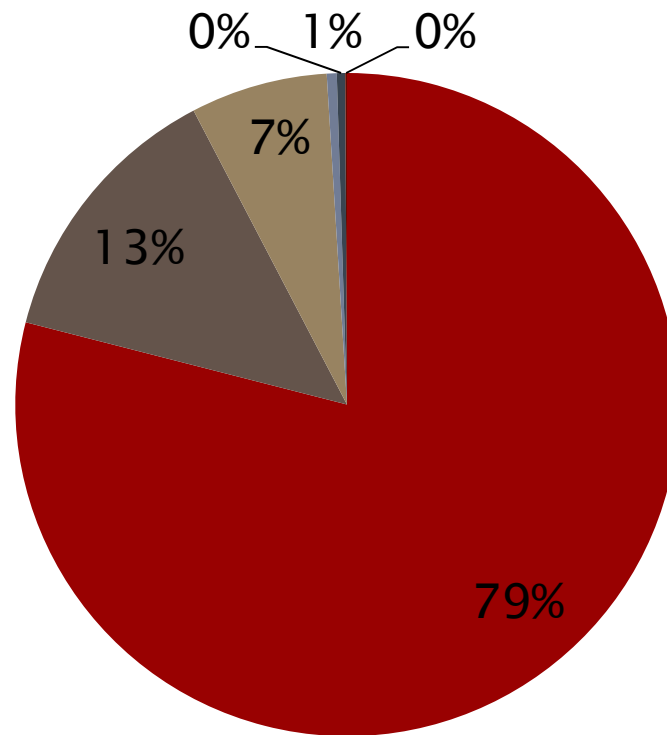
- ▶ Kerman High School has 75.34% of students participating in the Free/Reduced Lunch program

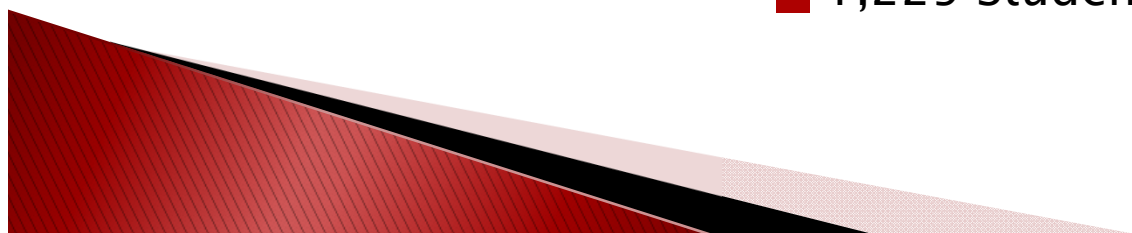
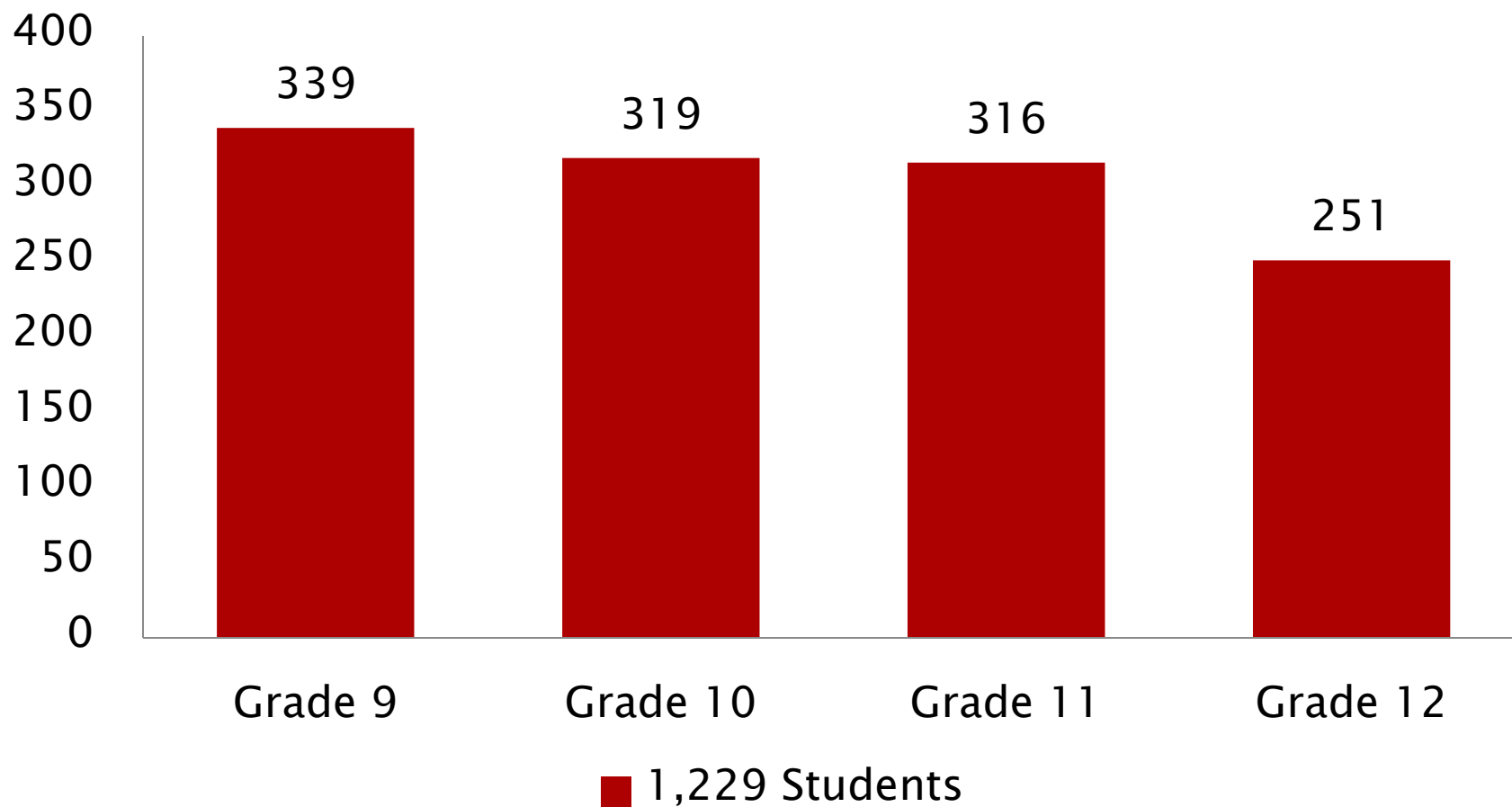

School Population by Grade

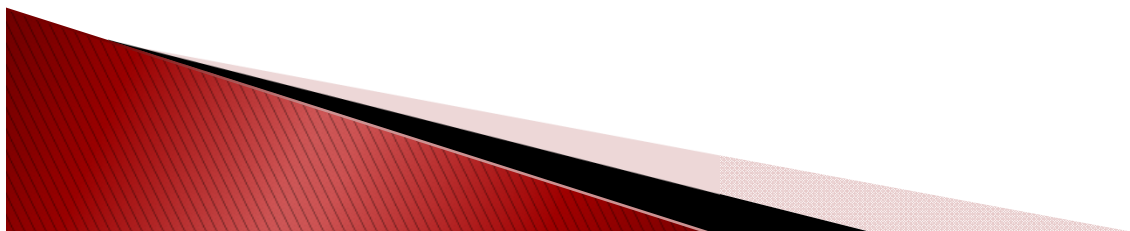

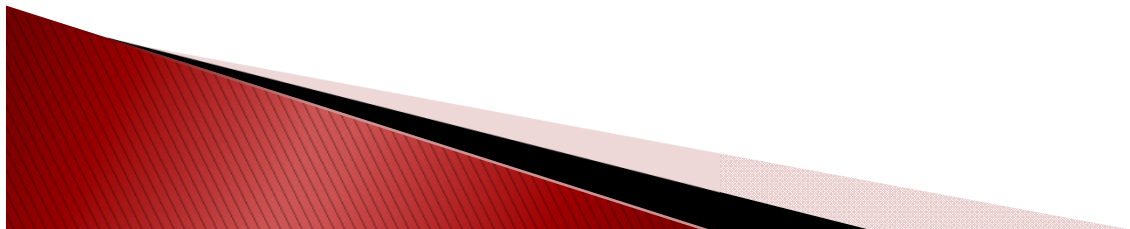

- ▶ All three counties total population:1,111,960



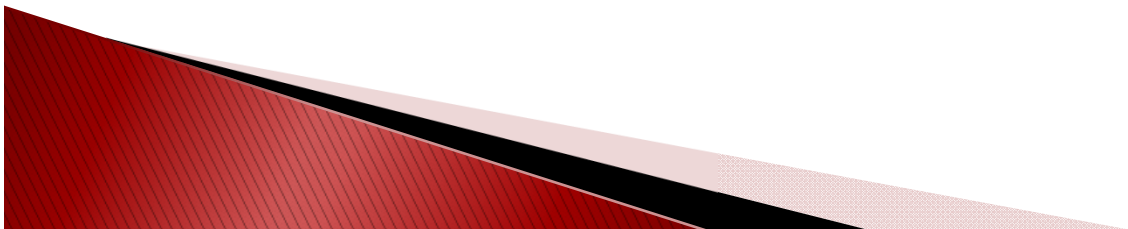

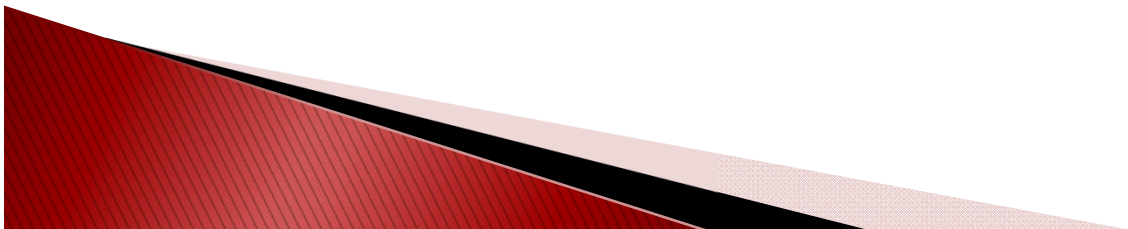

- ▶ Graduating Class of 2009 were the first recipients



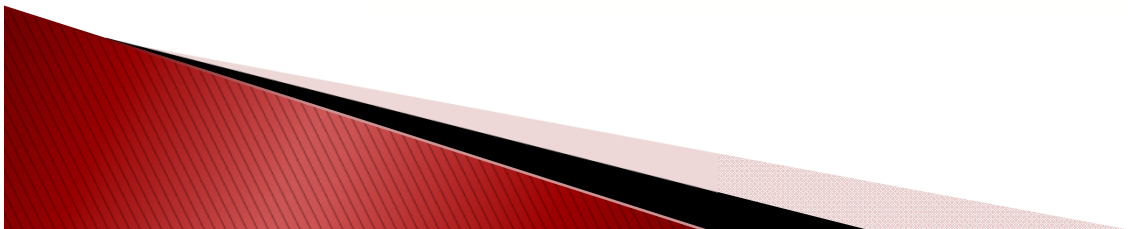

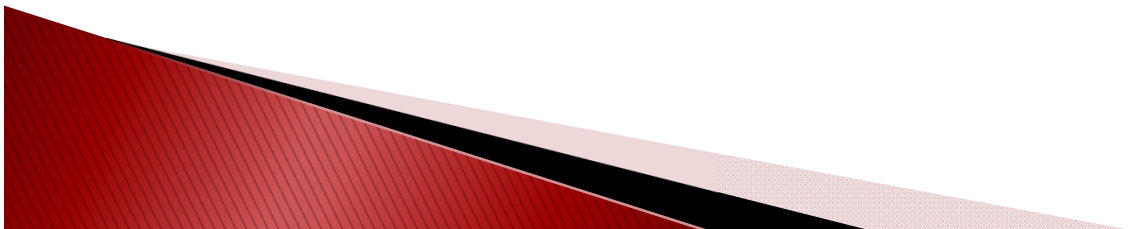
What Does It Take?

- ▶ Present awards (try to squeeze it in)

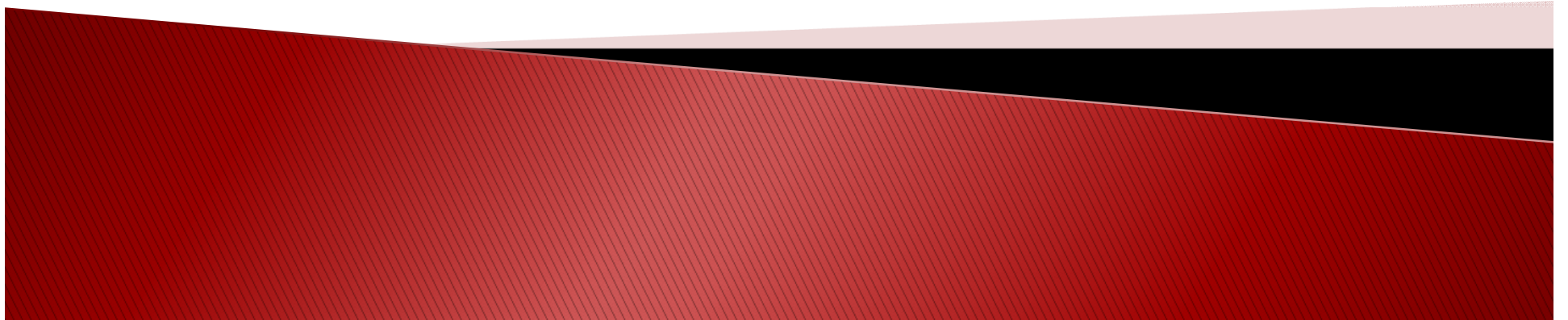
